




Wait list data: Patient consent and contact info.

— Health Status: EQ-5D

+ VAS

– Pain: BPI

– Depression: PHQ-9

Surveys recd/surveys

mailed: ~45-55%

Cold recd/cold surveys

mailed: ~41-51%
